The regular meeting of the Roaring Brook Township Board of Supervisors was held on Thursday, March 2, 2017 at 8:00pm at the Municipal Building on Blue Shutters Road. PUBLIC COMMENT

- Fauve Luckey thanked Police for extra coverage on Golf Club Road and wanted to know about the speed limit study for the road. Schield said he drove the road with a representative from LTAP five times at different speeds and they will determine what speed limit can be set -20's to 35. When recommendation is made then the Township will set the speed limit. It would be best to have the same speed limit for the entire road.
- Monica Scaduto wanted to know if there was any news about the Ross Property since last month. The Supervsors said they have heard nothing from DEP during the month. Danielle Chick said she called Datom and they did not call her back.
- Jordan said Township is not in charge DEP is in charge.
