UNFINISHED BUSINESS

- Paving Road Department went out and did measurements and had meeting with Engineer to determine what roads to pave and will add a few extra to see how much more the cost will be for roads.
- A MOTION by Farischon, and seconded by Schield to authorize expenditures of \$250,000 of borrowed money for paving and to get bids for specific roads with alternates. Motion carried.
- We did not get all of the grant money we applied for. We are less \$26,000. Township employees could do drainage work.
- Schield would like to put Golf Club Road and paving project out for bid at the same time hoping the same contractor gets the two bids.
- A MOTION by Schield, and seconded by Farischon to proceed with Golf Club Road project on dirt portion to be paved completely with Gambling money Grant, CGBG Grant and in kind work by Township. Motion carried.

NEW BUSINESS

- Township has two surplus Police vehicles since the purchase of the two new Ford Police vehicles. Hawley Police Department is in need of another vehicle and has made an offer of \$2700 for the 2008 Chevrolet. Supervisors would like to negotiate for a price.
- A Motion by Farischon, and seconded by Schield to negotiate the sale of the 2008 Chevrolet Police car with equipment as is. Motion carried.

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- Police Department would like to have both vehicles equipped with the same rifles. We have a left handed rifle that no one uses. We could get a good price for the AR15. Chief would like to trade in AR15.
- A MOTION by Farischon, and seconded by Schield to authorize Chief Hickey to trade in left handed AR15 and get a right handed AR15. Motion carried.
